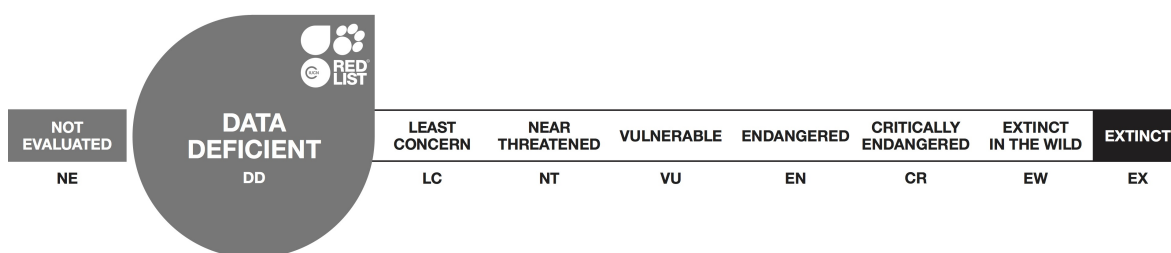

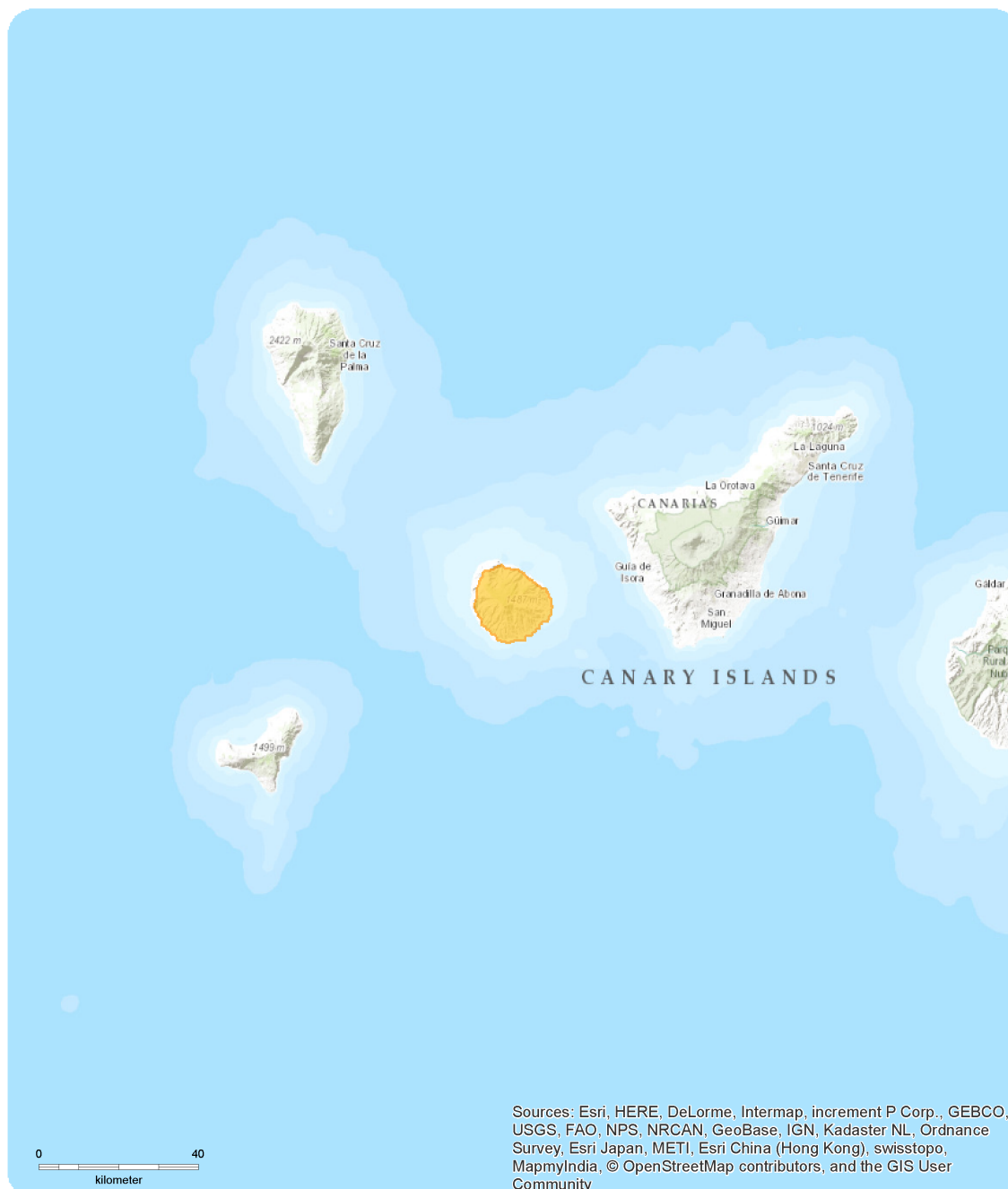

Distribution Map

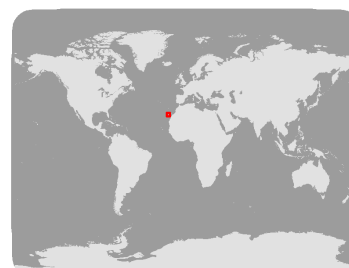
