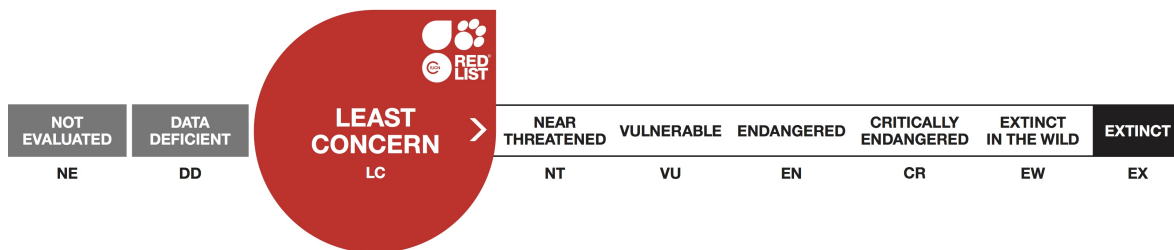

Taxon Name: *Monilearia umbicula* (Shuttleworth, 1852)

Taxonomic Notes:

Until recently, the taxonomic status of this species had been unclear, and its provenance has been unclear (Bank *et al.* 2002). However, new investigations suggest that this taxon in fact is a member of the genus *Monilearia* (unpublished data, Ibanez, Alonso and Groh, pers. comm., 2011).

Justification:

This species is relatively widespread and there is no known major threat. It is therefore considered to be Least Concern (LC).

Geographic Range

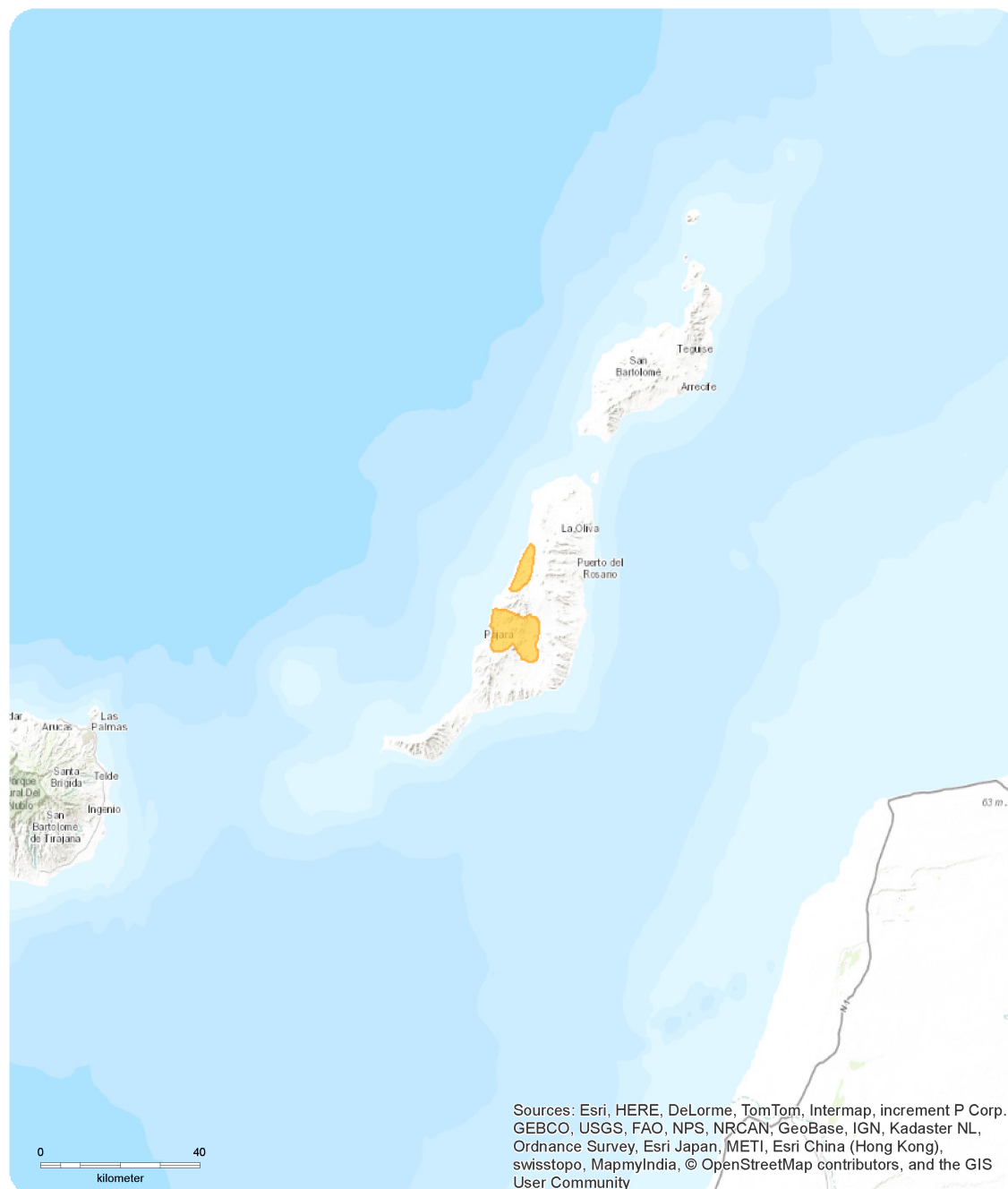
Range Description:

This species is endemic to Fuerteventura and probably to Lanzarote. On Fuerteventura, it occurs in a quite large range in the central part of the island. The species is common and widespread in its area of distribution.

Distribution Map

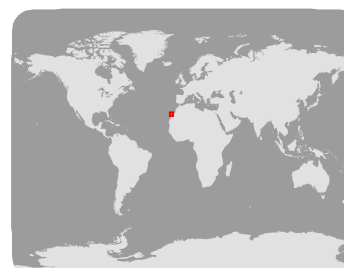


Monilearia umbicula
