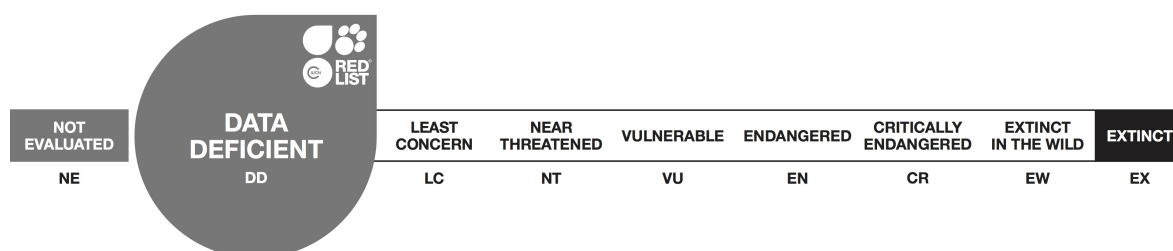

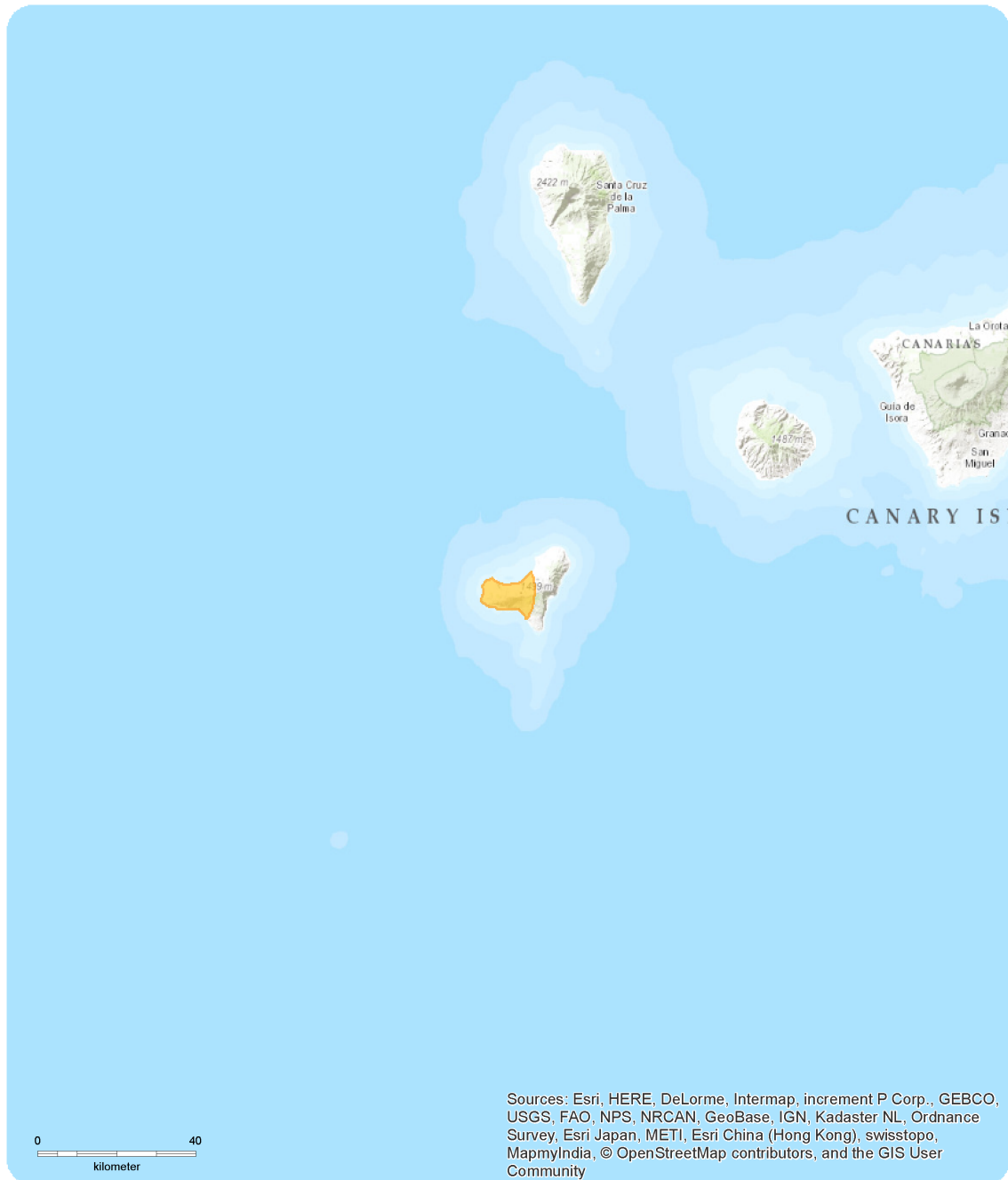
Range Description:

Distribution Map

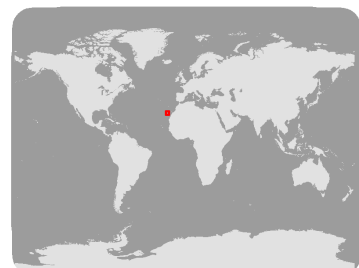
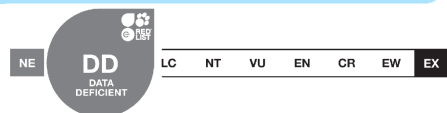
