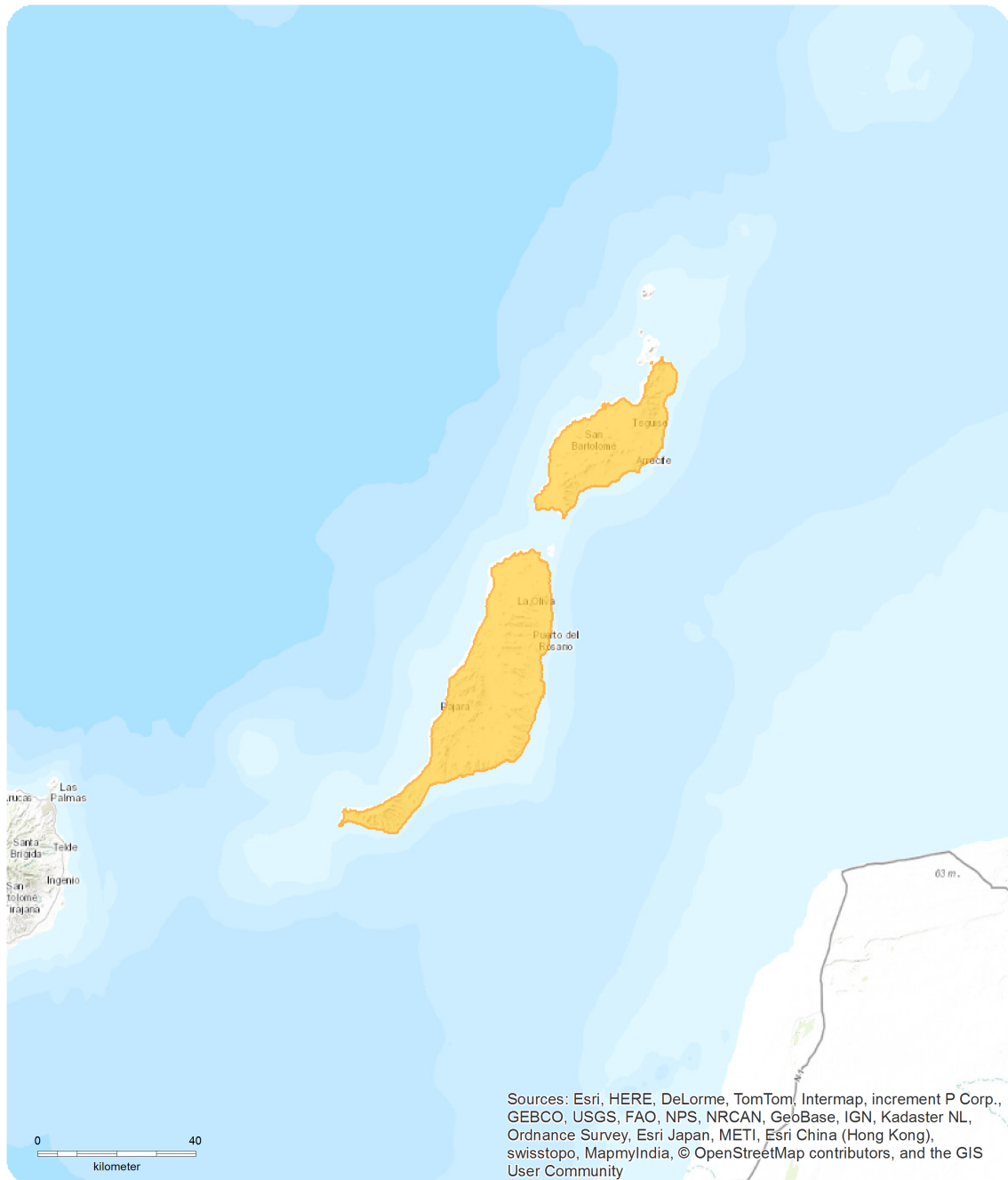

# Distribution Map

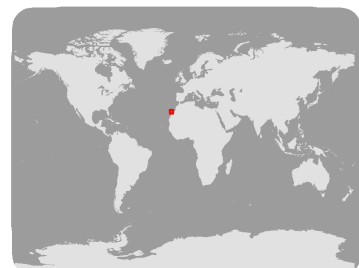
